## Resolution # 2-2004

A resolution modifying local traffic regulations as pertains to Ordinance #276, Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities, 2003 Edition

WHEREAS the City of South Haven, Kansas, did on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2003 adopt Ordinance #276, an ordinance incorporating the Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities, 2003 Edition.

AND WHEREAS it is now determined that a modification is now needed in an effort to protect and provide for the safety of persons and property in the City of South Haven, Kansas. The governing body of the City of South Haven, Kansas finds that a potentially dangerous situation presently exists concerning the operation of all-terrain vehicles, dirt bikes, mini-bikes, go-carts, mopeds, scooters, golf carts, and other motorized non-street legal means of transportation on the city streets, alleys, highways, sidewalks, public property, and public easements. The governing body deems it in the best interest of the residents of the City of South Haven to regulate the usage of these persons operating such vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SOUTH HAVEN, KANSAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Any person operating an ATV, dirt bike, mini-bike, go-cart, moped, scooter, golf cart, or any other motorized non-street legal vehicle not tagged by the state upon the city streets, alleys, highways, sidewalks, public property, and public easements of South Haven, Kansas, must be at least 16 years of age and hold a valid state issued drivers license.

Section 2. This resolution is merely a modification and an addendum to Ordinance #276, which is still in full force and in no way intended to conflict with the full scope of the ordinance.

Resolution #2-2004 shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage, approval, and publication one time in the official city newspaper one time and until changed or modified by subsequent ordinance or resolution of this governing body.
